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Background of the Program

“Physicians worldwide, regardless of their nationality, strive to do what is best for their patients. The objective of the Salzburg Medical Seminars is to help physicians achieve their goals by providing free, state of the art information and education in a neutral, non-threatening environment, which fosters the free exchange of ideas and experiences.”

The Open Medical Institute (OMI) is a global educational initiative. Established in 1993 by doctors from Weill Cornell Medicine and NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital and trustees of the American Austrian Foundation (AAF), the OMI works to bridge the knowledge gap between the East and the West and prevent brain drain from countries in transition. The AAF and the Salzburg Stiftung of the AAF organize the program in close collaboration with their academic partner institutions. Both public and private donors fund the program. Mid-career level, English-speaking physicians from countries in transition may apply to the seminars. Once accepted, they are invited to Salzburg to meet with an internationally renowned American and European faculty to exchange knowledge and experiences over a five-day period.

Since 1993, more than 2,300 faculty members from Weill Cornell Medicine and its affiliated hospitals (NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital, Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, Hospital for Special Surgery), as well as the Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia, Duke University Medical Center, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Columbia University and Cleveland Clinic, and their Austrian and European colleagues, have donated over 5,300 weeks of their time to train more than 24,500 physicians from 128 different countries and regions in current medical standards and practices.

Seminars are structured with didactic lectures in the morning and faculty-led workshops in the afternoon. Typically, there are 35 fellows from all around the world and four to six faculty members. All participants live and work together in Schloss Arenberg. This environment fosters the free exchange of ideas and the opportunity to ask questions and develop professional relationships. These are some of the most important aspects of the program. By working together as colleagues, seminar participants return to their home countries better prepared to treat their patients, and when in doubt, now have resources to find out what the best treatment modality is.

Please insert lecture titles and speakers. Didactic lectures are in the morning, followed by case presentations and workshops in the afternoon.

Morning sessions (8:00 am – 12:30 pm) include:

- Four one-hour didactic lectures: 45 minutes in length, followed by a 15-minute question-and-answer period.
- In order to measure how much fellows learn during the seminar, we administer a test on Monday morning and repeat the same test on Friday. The test consists of 15-25 multiple choice questions and lasts approximately 30 minutes.

Afternoon sessions (2:00 am – 5:00 pm) include:

- One one-hour didactic lecture on Monday, 45 minutes in length, followed by a 15-minute question-and-answer period.
- Case presentations (by faculty to fellows and fellows to faculty), computer workshops, video-conferences, clinic visits, etc. The faculty will receive the case presentation template that we send to fellows.

Seminar Curriculum/ USB Drive Production

The Course Director should encourage his/ her faculty to adhere to all deadlines. Please submit all materials electronically. The morning sessions will be recorded and transferred to a USB drive, to be handed out to the fellows at the conclusion of the seminar. You will have the possibility to review your lectures and slides for the USB drive in Salzburg. PowerPoint slides are required for all lectures. We prepare a syllabus for participants, which contains printouts of all PowerPoint lectures (six slides/ page). From our experience, this significantly increases the perception of the lectures. You may also add journal articles.

Please do not use any materials (images, charts, etc.) which you do not have permission to use, or would be uncomfortable publishing on the USB drive or the Web. See 'Copyright Issues' below.

Each seminar curriculum should include the following:

Lecture Summaries

All lectures, summaries and handouts should be in MS Word or ASCII (plain text) and submitted electronically

- Please provide keywords for each lecture.
- Please provide key references for each lecture.
- Our participants have very much appreciated receiving interesting and specific professional websites in their fields; thus, we encourage faculty to include web links.

Case Presentations

This is an important part of the academic workweek.

- Cases will be presented by the faculty and by the fellows. If available, please include reprints from your own publications.
- Course Directors should prepare a short PowerPoint on "How to Present a Case".
- To include in case presentations: written summary of findings, images, x-rays and other test findings.

- Please leave enough time during the week to review fellows' cases. We are collecting cases from fellows for our Online Case Library and we will ask you to choose the five best presentations of the week, as well as edit and sign-off on them as editors before you depart from Salzburg.

Guidelines for PowerPoint Slide Presentations

Please try to adhere to the following guidelines. This will ensure that your slides are legible at the seminar as well as on the USB drive and on the Internet.

- Do not use more than 60 slides for one lecture; **40 slides are ideal**.
- Please try to keep your files **under 50 MB**.
- **Avoid the use of animations** as they prevent the media team from recording your lectures properly for the USB drive that is produced.

Copyright Issues

Distribution of this USB drive is limited to the fellows of the OMI seminars. Because we are not charging for the reproduction or distribution of the USBs, this project is covered under the Fair Use Guidelines of the Copyright Act. These guidelines cover the use of copyrighted materials in your lectures, but please keep the following in mind:

- Every slide that contains copyrighted material must include a proper citation to the original source. If a copyrighted work is not credited, it may not be used.
- The Fair Use Guidelines stipulate that you may not use an excessive amount from any copyrighted source; please be conscious of this if you have more than three or four slides from any journal or book.
- For any slide not labeled with copyright information, we will assume it is an original slide. If you use images or text that you have published in another source, you must cite the publisher of that source.
- You will retain copyright on any original slides and on your lectures.

Patient Privacy

Unless the faculty can provide a copy of written documentation that the patient has granted permission, please make sure that patient privacy is protected (black bars occluding eyes, pixelated blurring of faces, names removed from X-rays, etc.).

Technical Support

A fast computer connected to the internet and a digital projector is available for your presentations. An overhead projector, pointer, and flipchart are also available.

- **Video Files:** In order to ensure optimal projection of your video files, it is important to have all the videos in the same folder and linked directly to your presentation. Put this main folder on a USB drive and bring with you to Salzburg (please still deliver your slides beforehand).
- **Laptops:** We prefer that you do not present from your own laptops because it hinders the recording system that is used for producing the USB drive.

OMI Seminar Presentations (Lectures, Summaries and Case Presentations in PowerPoint)

All PowerPoint presentations should be sent to the Salzburg office for review three weeks prior to your seminar date. All files will be reviewed for any potential content and technical issues. Travel Information

U.S. Faculty

Each seminar has a maximum of four (4) U.S. based faculty members including the course director. Each faculty member is entitled to one-round trip, special fare, business class ticket on Austrian Airlines from either New York (JFK), Newark (EWR), Washington-Dulles (IAD), Chicago (ORD), Toronto (YYZ) or Los Angeles (LAX) to Salzburg subject to availability. This ticket may be exchanged for two economy class tickets on Austrian Airlines should you wish to bring your spouse or a guest, provided the total fare for the two economy class tickets does not exceed the price of one special fare business class ticket. **Excess fare must be covered by the faculty member or participating institution/ hospital.**

Please note: Austrian Airlines tickets have to be issued three months before travel begins. Therefore, all U.S. faculty members must submit their requests to the OMI travel coordinators (travel@openmedicalinstitute.org) at least four months prior to the start of the seminar.

If the faculty member's travel DOES NOT originate in one of the above-mentioned cities (AUA hubs), then the faculty member will have to make his/her own travel arrangements in which our travel team will assist. The AAF will reimburse up to a maximum of \$3,500 for either one business class ticket or two economy class tickets. If the two economy class tickets to Salzburg are less than \$3,500, we will reimburse less, i.e. the actual ticket costs. If you fly to the Munich airport, we can book and pay a shuttle service to Schloss Arenberg. This service is only possible if you submit a direct request and receive a written confirmation from our office in Salzburg.

AAF will reimburse domestic travel in economy class to an Austrian hub airport in the U.S. as well as ground transportation (taxi, train) to and from the airport for faculty members. Ground transportation costs should not exceed \$300. Ground travel expenses in excess of \$300 are the sole responsibility of the faculty member. Please note that the AAF cannot reimburse U.S. domestic economy class flights for spouses, guests, children, rental cars, etc.

U.S. citizens do not require a visa for travel to Austria, unless their stay exceeds three months, but they **must have a valid U.S. passport, which is valid for at least six months after the end of their stay in Austria.** If you are not a U.S. citizen, please check whether you need a visa with the Austrian Embassy or one of the Austrian Consulates (<http://www.austria.org>).

Whether you wish for the AAF to book your flights or you intend to book them yourself, please complete the travel form and return it to the OMI travel coordinators (travel@openmedicalinstitute.org).

All faculty flying to Salzburg will be met at the Salzburg Airport. Ground transportation from Schloss Arenberg to the airport will also be arranged for you.

European Faculty

The AAF will reimburse the European faculty member one round trip flight ticket in economy class, one round trip train ticket in first class, or mileage if you travel by car. Should you wish to bring your partner, kindly contact the Salzburg OMI travel coordinators (office@schlossarenberg.at). OMI Salzburg must approve travel costs and itineraries **prior** to the purchase of tickets.

ESU Europe Based Faculty

The ESU will cover travel for European faculty attending the ESU/ Weill Cornell Master Class in Urology. Please contact Jacobijn Sedelaar-Maaskant (j.maaskant@uroweb.org) to make your travel arrangements. U.S.-based faculty arrangements will be handled by the OMI travel coordinators (travel@openmedicalinstitute.org), per the guidelines stated above. The ESU Master Class will take place from July 10-16, 2022.

Austrian Faculty

The AAF will reimburse one round trip train ticket in first class, or mileage if you travel by car. If you arrive by train, please take a taxi from Salzburg main train station to the venue (ca. 15 minutes) and keep the receipt for reimbursement.
